Most of the residents living in nursing homes and the staff are anxious to see Molly. She slips between wheelchairs, and puts her paws up on padded knees. I often hear, "I always had a dog but it has been years since I have been able to pet one." Some of my most memorable hospice visits have been with the family members of a patient who is in the process of dying. Their time spent with Molly is time free of grief.



This past year we have been invited to a second location. Pine Grove Elementary is a totally different type of visit. Molly and I focus on three wonderful third grade boys. Walking her, reading to her and, working with her commands are some of our activities. Molly loves the busy hallways, the crowded classrooms, and the attention from the facility. Both Molly and I enjoy the change of pace.
